Sunday, June 6, 2024 our 14 Girls State Citizens arrived at Texas Lutheran University where they checked in and were directed to their mythical city where they met their fellow citizens. Those girls applying for the Samsung Scholarship turned them in. Our Citizens were split up between 14 different cities labeled City A to City N. Staff in each city consisted of one senior and two junior counselors who helped the girls get settled in to their dorm rooms with their new roommates. It is customary NOT to put girls from the same school in the same city so that the girls can meet others from throughout the state, but doesn't take the girls long to make new friends in their new cities.

All staff was on deck to assure a smooth move in of the 600 girls. Girls State staff includes Director Lori Swan, Co-Director Connie Bridges, Associate Director of Administration Ann Doan, Associate Director of Personnel Karen Rodriguez, Associate Director of Programs Stephanie McDonald, Associate Director of Education Katie Stewart, three nurses, four program support associates, 8 House and Senate directors, 7 Education/County Coordinators, 4 bank associates, 2 party leaders, 5 talent associates, 4 Girls State Store associates, 1 transportation associate, 3 marketing associates, 14 senior and 28 junior counselors as well as several ancillary associates.

Daily activities included marching to the flag, raising the United States and Texas flags, and reciting the pledge of allegiances. Patriotism and Americanism are two principles that were stressed. The girls quickly learned that wherever they marched in unity they sang, and they quickly learned the songs.

On City Day, our Citizens were excited and thrilled to assemble with 600 others where presentations were made by Girls State Director Lori Swan and Co-Director Connie Bridges as well as Ann Doan, Associate Director of Administration. This was followed by several speakers who addressed the citizens to encourage and inspire the Citizens for the week. They included:

<u>President of Texas Lutheran University Dr. Debbie Cottrell encouraged</u> the citizens by stating "I congratulate you for accepting the nomination to be here, to focus and grow, laugh and learn, take advantage of the challenges, and go home a better person."

<u>American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Texas, President Holly Heatly</u> told citizens "This week will take you out of your comfort zone but you will leave this place fearless, confident, and ready to take on the world."

<u>The Honorable Donna Dodgen, Mayor of Seguin,</u> addressed some of her challenges as mayor and the skills she used to overcome them to the Citizens. She emboldened them with her comment "You can do anything that you want to, and you can do anything together."

Following the speakers, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House announced the Floorleaders for the 80th session which included National and Federal Party Leaders for the Senate and the House of Representatives. Citizens then returned to their individual cities to draft their city charters and elect city officials as well as take part in their first House and Senate sessions. They also began to learn about the legislative process through the legislative staff.
